

2nd Carbon Budget Programme (2022 – 2024) High Level Workplan





- Carbon Budgets modelling workshop to consider and review the evidence required and the analytical tools available for the 2nd Carbon Budget Programme
- Macroeconomic analysis will need to be developed further for the the 2nd Carbon Budget Programme in order to assess the impacts of the transition.
- A period of scenario modelling during Q4 2023 Q3 2024 to inform proposals for the 2nd Carbon Budget Programme is anticipated.
- The CCAC is required to prepare and agree the final proposal for Carbon Budget 3 (2031 2035) and to develop the provisional proposal for the Carbon Budget 4 (2036 2040) for submission to the Minister of Environment Climate and Communications by Q4 2024.
